**The Music Stand:** A good friend mentioned that she wanted me to make a gift for her favorite elementary school music teacher. I recommended a music stand and she agreed. I spent about five hours coming up with the basic design. Next, I refined the dimensions by interviewing, a local music teacher and doing Internet research. During the build, I made several design refinements. My guess is I spent approximately 20 hours for design work on the project.

The turned parts of the stand turned out to be the easiest and most enjoyable part of the build. After gluing up the base, I consulted Jack Wayne for chucking ideas and turning advice. He even loaned his lathe and effort, when I discovered my lathe would not work for turning the underside of the base.

It was interesting that some of the simplest parts of the project turned out to be the most time consuming. I would not have guessed it would have taken hours of tweaking to get some of the parts into the proper alignment.

The construction materials were: Baltic birch plywood, walnut, and quilted maple.

All in all, I guess I spent over 80 hours to create and build the stand. It was exciting to see the thing progress from paper to final piece of artwork.

The new owner and person that commissioned my time both cried when I delivered the stand. I believe they were tears of joy.

I am hoping to create my next stand in less than 50 hours. ~Eugene Bagdon

#### Next Month's Demonstrator



Art Liestman is a part-time woodturner living in Coquitlam, B.C. (a suburb of Vancouver). Art has been involved with woodworking for 30 years. Originally, his interest was in designing and making experimental musical instruments. He stumbled into woodturning when he needed some turned parts for an automated programmable xylophone. As many others have, he quickly became passionate about woodturning. After a few years of making functional items, he turned to the artistic side of woodturning.

Known particularly for his puzzling illusion series of turnings that resemble jigsaw puzzles, his work often involves surface enhancements using pyrography and coloring. He is also interested in breaking the symmetry of traditional turned forms and exploring more sculptural work.

Art has demonstrated at national and regional symposia, as well as for dozens of local clubs. He recently taught week long courses at the John C. Campbell Folk School and will be at the Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts later this year. His work has been seen in numerous exhibitions and is available through several galleries across North America.

#### Demo descriptions:

In the evening demo, Art will demonstrate how to turn a "lost wood goblet". This particular project shows one method of producing lathe turned work that is "beyond round". This method opens up some interesting possibilities for exploring new shapes. This demonstration should be of interest to all woodturners.

In the full day demo, Art will will continue the exploration of "beyond round" turning, by showing a multiaxis technique called "therming" or "barrel turning" that can be used to produce multi-sided turned objects. This technique was traditionally used for producing objects such as table legs, but it can also be used to produce interestingly shaped hollow vessels or sculptural forms.

He will also discuss the design and making of wooden teapots, showing some details of how his teapots are made. The demo will include methods of joining turned objects and creating and bending turned spindles.
