August - John Howard



Like so many of us, John Howard had a decades long break between being introduced to woodturning in high school woodshop classes and taking it up again. In the interim, he completed a Biology degree, served 5-years in the Army, and had a long career as a teacher dean of instruction, first at Portland Community College and then at

Bates Technical College in Tacoma.

John returned to wood turning shortly before he retired from Bates in 2012. He joined the South Puget Sound Woodturners in 2014, and since then joined the SPSW board and often acts as a mentor at monthly sawdust sessions.

At the SPSW's August meeting, John will demonstrate how to make a segmented pen, which is a relatively simple project, that is a good introduction to more complex segmented turning projects. Also highlighted during this demonstration will be using a skew chisel to minimize tear out and use of cyanoacrylate (super glue) as a finish.



President's 2017 Challenges

We are starting a new feature for SPSW general meetings in 2017, a President's Challenge, which will be open to all members who wish to participate. The purpose of the challenge is to take you out of your 'comfort zone' and encourage you to learn new techniques, the use of different tools, and encourage problem solving. The idea is to make the item (s) which meet the requirements listed in the chart below and bring it or them for Show and Tell at the specified monthly meeting. Please note some items set a test parameter.

Just bring your completed piece to the general meeting on the 3rd Thursday of the listed month. Each "challenge" allows you freedom of expression and there is no expectation regarding what you turn, so long as it meets the criteria listed.

Items will be judged by an impartial panel, based on the description in the requirements section. All participants will get a round of applause and the satisfaction of having acquired some new skill and knowledge. Each entrant will get a Participation Award ticket for the annual PA drawing in December. The winner will get 2 tickets.

Meeting	Challenge	Requirements to be met
February 16th	Sphere	Challenge completed
April 20 th	Birdhouse	Challenge completed. Golf ball and tee was the winning bird house.
June 15 th	3 Tops	Challenge completed
*September 21 th	Footed natural edged vessel	Any size. Wall thickness at rim must not be more than 3/8ths of an inch thick and the edged vessel rest of the bowl must have a consistent wall thickness dimension which may differ from edged vessel rest of the bowl must have a consistent wall thickness dimension which may differ from the rim. The footed base may have 3 or more feet and the piece must stand with the rim parallel to the surface on which the piece sits No test to this. Originality, adherence to the requirements, style and effectiveness of footing, and amount of natural edge bark are the judging criteria. Your Choice of woods.
October 19 th	Lidded box	Any size or style, May be single box or stacked boxes, Requirement is that the piece must be a box with a lid. Test is how well the lid fits (not how tight the fit is). Extra points for innovative design, integrated knob (turned from the same piece of wood and not added onto the lid), threading the box and lid, originality, and overall aesthetic appeal. Your choice of woods.
December 21st	Holiday ornament	Be creative. Do something you have not done before using at least 2 species of wood. No test to this. Judging criteria include lightness (weight), originality, and design balance. Your choice of woods.

AAW Tips for Woodturners

Shopmade Vacuum Chucks:

Oneway Mfg. sells Taper-Lock adaptors (available in numerous spindle-thread sizes) that screw onto the headstock to hold Oneway chucks. This adaptor is also useful as the base for a shopmade vacuum chuck. The three vacuum chucks in the photo are all simple-turned wooden cylinders of differing diameters—I use them to support smaller pieces while I finish the bases. (The Oneway 3" [76 mm] aluminum drum chuck is shown for comparison.) The wooden cylinder fits snugly over the sleeve of the metal adaptor and is glued on with CA glue. Oneway sells a sticky-





backed neoprene ring that is cut to size to fit the top end of the vacuum chuck where it contacts the piece. Their largest neoprene ring is 12" diameter and is 1¾" (44 mm) wide (Part 3662).

The accompanying photo shows one of these chucks being used to support a small vase form prior to turning away the tenon and finishing the base.

If you do not have a vacuum set-up, these shopmade chucks are useful as mandrels to support small pieces held at the tailstock end by a small residual stub, which is removed later with a carving tool.
