

how much we appreciate her generosity! Please join us.



SPSW Mentors: Mentors are SPSW members that have enough experience to invite other club members into their shops and help them learning various turning skills. In the past, the SPSW has identified a group of skilled turners that invited people into their shops and helped people to gain new skills. This service is very valuable to newer turners and also helps connect our members with each other. Over the next couple of months, we will be asking for volunteers willing to fill this role.

Sometimes people hesitate to volunteer for such a role, thinking that they "don't know everything", and therefore aren't qualified to teach. The fact of the matter is, you don't need to be the best turner in the club or be a professional teacher to be very effective in this role! If you are able to have someone come over to your shop and are willing to pass on the skills that have been passed on to you, then you would be a great mentor. All you need is to have a solid understanding of basic turning techniques and be able to show people how to turn safely. Remember that some of our new members have never turned before, and just need a little help to get started. Also, if you have an unusual thing that you do, many people, both new and longer-term members, would love to have a little one-on-one time with you. Special or unusual things might be things like pepper mills, bowls, segmented turning, hollow-forms, lidded boxes, coring, stabilizing wood, or many other skills we are all trying to master.



- Please contact John Howard if you have questions or are interested in one of the openings.






President's 2018 Challenges

May	Embellished lathe turning	Completed	
June	Segmented Turn- ing	Cups, vessels, or bowls constructed out of rings of glued segments. Judged on number of pieces used (highest number does not automatically win) and the esthetics of the piece,	
August	One tool	Once the piece is mounted on the lathe, create a turned piece using only one tool. Pick any one tool to complete the entire project. No sanding or finish allowed. Judged on smoothness and lack of tear out.	
October	Inside/Outside	This technique involves turning 4 pieces at the same time to create a hollow, and then turning them around and gluing them together again, to turn the outside. The result is a hollow form open on the sides, and you can add various elements inside too. I suggest that you check YouTube videos Carl Jacobson inside out Turning for ideas



AAW Tips for Woodturners

Spindle-lock Solution

After reading about various solutions to the spindle-lock on JET lathes, here is my solution that frees up both hands. I have a JET 1442 lathe.

I removed the U-shaped metal guard and replaced it with an S-shaped piece of cherry. I used the original tapped holes to attach the piece of wood to the lathe. There are no loose parts to misplace and no parts dangling on a tether.

Not only does the pivoting arm hold the spindle-lock button depressed, it holds the power switch in the off position. I cannot turn on the power before releasing the spindle lock.
