# Letter from the President — Holiday Party!

December 2018	Holiday Decor	Ornaments, table decorations, Menorahs, candle holders and other items used to decorate for the holi- days	
January 2019	Pepper Mill	Create a pepper mill or salt/pepper combination. This project will be graded on pleasing form, beauty if the wood and grain pattern, texturing, Mills may be lami- nated or solid wood	
March 2019	Staved Seg- mented Turning	This project involves gluing up a turning blank out of angled sticks, like a tall ring on a normal segmented turning.	
April 2019	Collaborative Project	Use this as an opportunity for two or more members to work together to create an art like project. Perhaps one member could design, another member could do the turning, one could apply surface texture or color.	
June 2019	Suspended Form	This is a lidded hollow form using an undercut rim de- sign that is supported by legs that are connected to the vessel body by metal or wooden cross members. This is an "artsy" project. Let your imagination run wild!	
August 2019	One tool	Make any sort of turning using only a single tool. No finish, no sanding, one tool only. Entry's will be judged on how clean the cuts are.	
November 2019	Holiday Decor	Ornaments, table decorations, Menorahs, candle holders and other items used to decorate for the holi- days
