

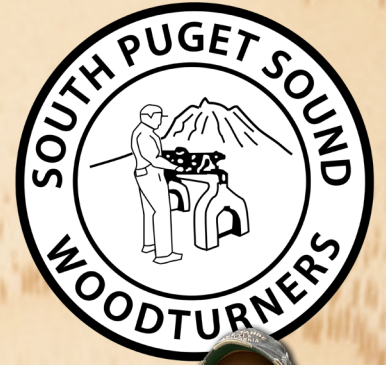

June's Remote Demo: Steve Sinner Part Two

This month, on the evening of June 17th, we will feature Steve Sinner's second installment of his 2-part interactive remote demonstration of his deep hollowing. This will be another Zoom presentation.

During our May meeting, Steve demonstrated his method of end-grain turning to produce a vase-like hollow form. This month, Steve will demonstrate how he prepares the now dry rough-turned vase with a second turning, surface prep, and preparation for finishing.

Steve will discuss how to use many different techniques and materials for embellishment and finishing. His presentation will cover gilding with silver foil, patinas, and application of color using many different materials and techniques. Last, he will address application of a finish to protect the work and make it stand out.

On July 17th and 18th 2021, the AAW will be hosting their second annual Virtual Symposium. The in-person annual AAW Symposium was canceled in February due to Covid issues. In its place, a virtual symposium will happen on July 17th and 18th.



This Virtual Symposium is a great deal. The cost of registration for the entire event is only \$45 for AAW members and \$60 for others. This allows you into 12 Zoom-based presentations. That works out to \$3.75/demo! And if you are unable to watch it at that time, registered attendees will also have access to recorded replays of the featured demonstrations and panel discussions.

Like last year, there will be a series of well-known and very capable woodturners, each doing full demonstrations. Get in on wood cutting opportunities: If you would like to be notified when we are going out to cut wood so you can get a little for yourself, please let our wood-rat, Doug Reynolds, know. You don't necessarily need your own chain saw. There are many things that folks can do to help at these events. But you will see how to safely use a chain saw and also will see how to section the tree so you get the best and most interesting wood out of it. You will also have access to people who can help you get started on how to seal the wood to minimize checking, explain the advantages of green wood turning, rough turning, and coring processes. If that sounds interesting to you, please let Doug know, and he can put you on his list and you will be contacted by e-mail when he has wood we're going out to cut. 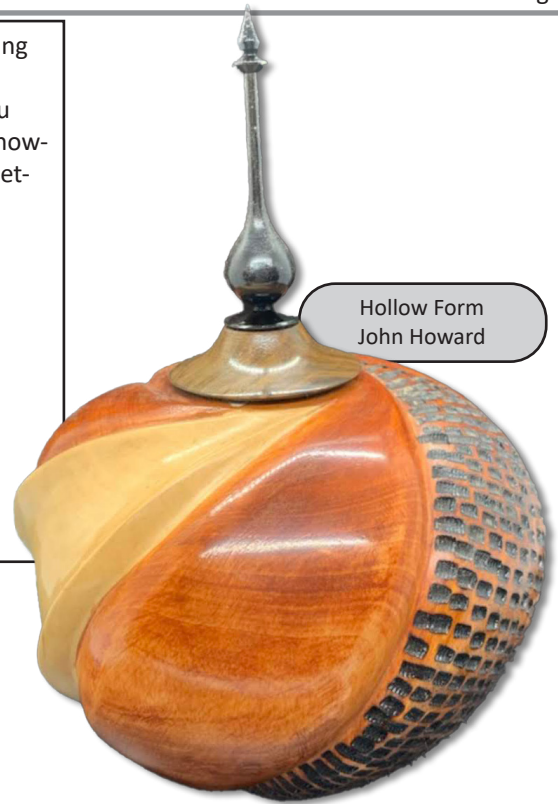

A Word from Kent Horton, the AAW liason

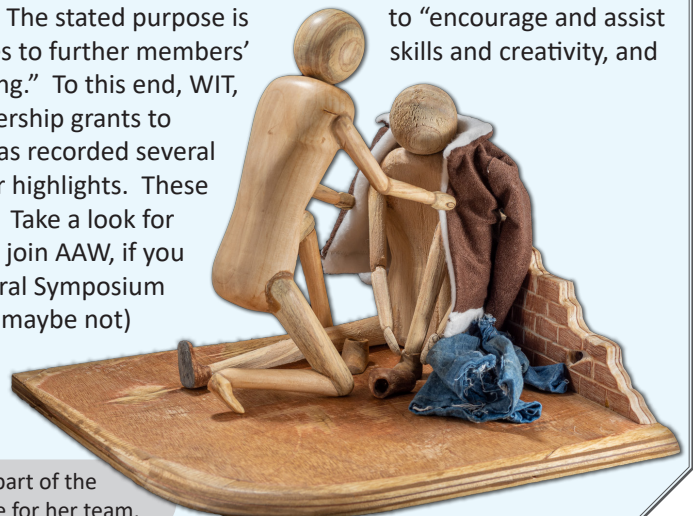
Hello again fellow SPSW members. I recently received an email from Suzette asking if I knew anything about the AAW (American Association of Woodturners) WIT (Women in Turning) program. I had read a couple of short articles, but knew very little of their program. Suzette spoke to the Virtual eXchange program that is currently taking place, whereby women turners from all over the world register and are put into teams consisting of experienced (professional) turners with those of limited or even no turning experience and, as a team, are directed to make something representing a couple of words drawn from a bag. (Talk about collaborative creativity!) Each team member creates their part of the project independently and sends it on to others on their team to be assembled as a final project. Again, this year this is all being done remotely. In June, one person from each team will develop and share a short presentation of their project and discuss the collaboration involved in its completion. Past works have been amazing and I am looking forward to seeing what these teams come up with this year.

The eXchange program is but one example of the various programs and events sponsored by the WIT committee of the AAW. After Suzette's email I decided to learn more about WIT. The stated purpose is to increasing participation of women in the field of woodturning." To this end, WIT, in conjunction with AAW, provides a limited number of membership grants to both new and renewing female members. Additionally, WIT has recorded several profiles of well-known women turners and their turning career highlights. These have been most enjoyable to watch – such amazing creativity! In-person Demo with Seri “Dr. Spalt” Robinson: Next month, the Seattle Woodturners chapter will host Dr. Seri Robinson for an all-day demonstration. Seri is an artist, woodturner, and is also a professor at Oregon State University. Her work involves coloring wood using mold fungi. The coloration that is left on wood after attack by mold is often referred to as “spalting”.

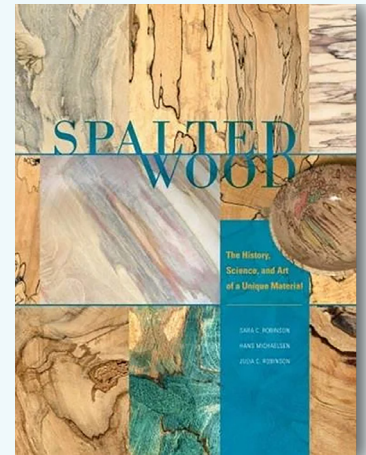
During her morning session Seri will demonstrate tips and tricks for turning spalted wood, and specifically, how to handle wood that has become “punky” during the spalting process. The afternoon session will cover the use of Dichloromethane (DCM AKA Methylene Chloride) and other topics.

This clinic will run on Saturday, July 10th, 2021 from 9:00AM until 5:00PM. It will be held at the Wood Technology Center located at 2310 S. Lane St., in Seattle (98144). The cost is \$35 for Seattle Woodturners members and \$40 for non-members.



Dr. Robinson is also a well-known wood turner. In the morning she will demonstrate how to turn spalted woods in a way that minimizes tear-out. In the afternoon, she will demonstrate how to use fungal materials to color wood.

Zoom Meeting If you haven't been on Zoom before, just follow the steps below. **(If you have been in a Zoom meeting before, just start at step 3.)**

1. **The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members.** So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2019, you will need to go to the members tab on the [SPSW website](http://spswoodturners.org) (spswoodturners.org) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.

2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free "Zoom Meetings" app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
3. **Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:**
 - a. **Saturday, June 12th** – The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member's distribution list.
 - i. This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
 - ii. Please save this where you can find it.
 1. If you don't see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your "junk" or "spam" folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
 - b. **Wednesday, June 16th** – A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member's distribution list.
 - c. **Thursday, June 17** - Log into the meeting between 6:30 and 7:00pm
 - i. Steve's demo will start promptly at 7:00pm.
 - ii. When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer "yes" to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
 - iii. **Note:** If you have previously downloaded the app, you may see an update is available. If you see it, please update your app. Zoom is making frequent changes to the program to strengthen security.
 - iv. Devices used to view the demo can be smartphones, tablet computers, laptops, etc. To fully participate, the device needs to have audio and a camera.

For Zoom Security, Please Rename If Needed: We have a number of people that participate in the Zoom demos. When you join the session, you will be able to see yourself and the other participants in thumbnail photos with the name of each person under their picture. If your name appears as "John's iPad", or "iPhone 189567", then we don't really know who you are, which is a security issue. If that happens when you join the meeting, please just click on your name, and then click "rename" and change it to your full name. It will help Ramon and me as we co-host the meeting. Thanks!

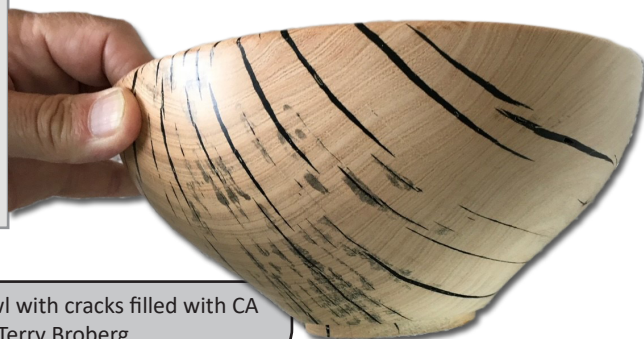
