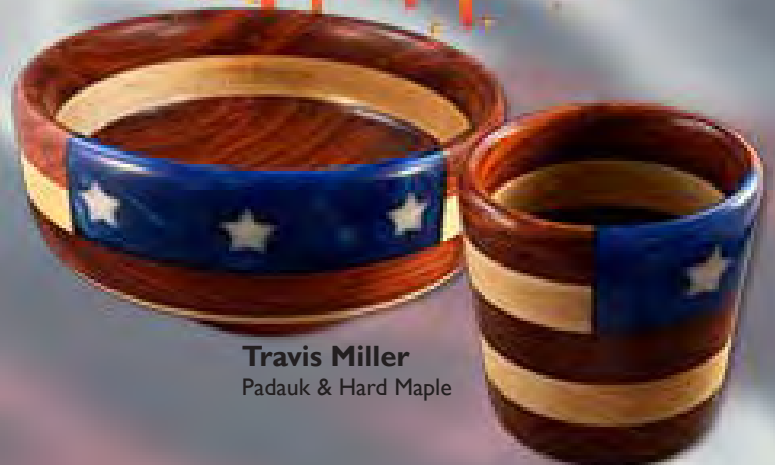

Optimal Wood Harvest for Interesting Figure

Our July demonstrator will be none other than our own Devin Garlick who is currently in his first year leading our chapter's Wood Rats Team. Devin and Kathy joined SPSW in 2020 shortly after watching members from the Woodturners of Olympia demonstrate at the Washington State Fair. The Olympia turners suggested to them that the SPSW in Fife, WA, might be a closer chapter for them to join. Shortly after, fortunately for us, they joined our chapter.



Devin enjoys turning anything unique. Whenever I have been at the Saturday Sawdust Sessions at Wayne's place, it's common to eventually find Devin with a large round of whatever odd species of wood he has come across that week chucked up on one of the lathes with chips flying. Devin is a kind, soft spoken, hardworking lumberjack who is always willing to help others. He enjoys sharing his woodturning and chain sawing knowledge with SPSW members interested in finding the best object from a chosen log. Devin taught me how to plan and cut a log length-ways (i.e. a riff cut with very long shaving). That lesson has been invaluable to me for getting through the first half of wood blank preparation.

During Devin's demonstration he will guide our members using his woodturner's eye as he presents various tree features that yield desirable and interesting figure. Are you able to see the bowl or vase inside the turning blank or even the freshly cut log? Devin can. He will share his knowledge and experience for seeing the figure inside the tree solely based on what can be observed on the outside of the tree. Knowing the tree species is also useful for predicting the appearance of the grain and other characteristics. You won't want to miss this informative demonstration.

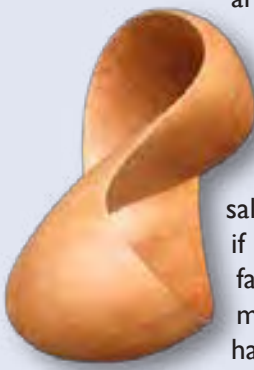
A Word From Kent Horton AAW Liason

Hello, this is Kent Horton once again. As your SPSW/AAW liaison, I see my charge as two-fold: (1) providing ongoing communication between AAW (American Association of Woodturners) and SPSW, and (2) encouraging our SPSW members to join AAW as a vehicle to promoting a higher quality of objects turned on the lathe – yours and mine included.

Earlier this week I had a wonderful conversation with two of the nice folks at AAW – Robyn (sp?) and Melissa. I called to inquire about the when and where of the 2027 AAW International Symposium. Here it is!! – The latest news!! The 2027 AAW International Symposium will be on July 24-27 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. I know, I know, it will be “iffy” concerning the weather. Does it really get that hot towards the end of July in Oklahoma City? I have been led to believe that if it is hot outside, it is always air conditioned indoors – If you believe that!

I have no doubt that the list of presenters that will be included in the different sessions will be outstanding, as usual!

Over this past week or so, I have been watching the virtual sessions of this past AAW Symposium. My goal is to get at least one or two usable techniques or skills from each of the presenters. I have been so very impressed with the seemingly effortless turning skills with near perfect tool control – things I struggle with. Many of these presenters are able to use their humor and “gift of gab” to connect with their audience while teaching their own specialized turning skill or technique. Diane Friend, from here in our area, demonstrated how she incorporates using a biscuit joiner in bridging larger cracks to make and mend otherwise unusable chunks of wood into something safe to turn and eventually a beautiful bowl, platter or hollow-form. Sheri Robinson, from Oregon, spoke to techniques for turning spalted wood with minimal tear-out. Mike Mahony demonstrated turning both an heirloom salt/pepper mill and a large (18-inch) white oak platter – both items were beautiful!! I don’t know if I will ever turn a Singapore Ball, and I am not terribly interested in turning pens, however, I was fascinated to learn what it takes to elevate a pen kit and make it into a \$500.00 pen. I can’t see me making a mobius, with all the grinding and wood sculpting involved. It is good to know that I have until September 24th to rewatch these videos as often as I want, or need, to make sure I fully understand a technique I want to try.

I encourage everyone reading this to start thinking whether or not next year’s AAW Symposium is something you might be interested in attending – Oklahoma City is only about 3 ½ hours away by air or 28 ½ hours of driving time by automobile (and think of all the interesting side trips you might make as well!). Ethan Green was planning on attending this years’ AAW Symposium. I’ve not yet had an opportunity to speak with him about his impressions. You might ask him about his thoughts and reactions.

Kaden's Cause



Our president Kathy Garlick learned of Kaden's Cause from her relationship with AAW. [Kaden's Cause](#) is a Florida-based non-profit that supports families affected by the tragedy of losing a child by assisting low-wealth individuals and families with funding to cover funeral/cremation costs, and spread kindness throughout our communities. We, the South Puget Sound Woodturners, have the opportunity to support Kaden's Cause by providing urns for them to distribute to folks who have suffered unimaginable loss.

With requests for five to seven urns each week, there is always a need for more. Their perfect urn will have a threaded lid and will accommodate a range of 5 to 60 cubic inches. That's equal to about a half-cup to a quart. The wood and finish can be whatever one has available. These are lifelong memorials to the infants and small children that they have loved and lost. Because the urns are made with love and are works of art the families are reminded that their child's life mattered not only to them but to others.

Our current idea is to collect urns at quarterly intervals to send to Florida in one package to minimize shipping cost.

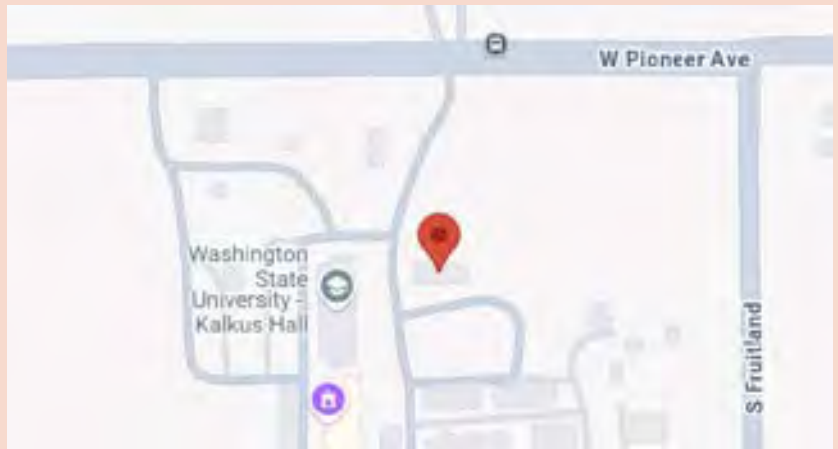

If you enjoy SPSW please take the time to renew your membership.

The dues for 2026 are only \$55 for the entire year and that is for your whole family.

1. **The Zoom meeting invitation is only sent to active members.** So, if you have not paid your dues since October 2025, you will need to go to the members tab on the [SPSVW website](https://www.spsvw.org) (spswoodturners.org) and renew your membership. Please note that it would normally cost more for just one of these demonstrations than your SPSW dues for the entire year.
2. Before the scheduled meeting, you need to go to zoom.com and download the free “Zoom Meetings” app. The Zoom download is quick, easy, and free!
3. **Information and Invitation Delivery Schedule:**
 - a. **The Wednesday the week before the meeting** – The Zoom Meeting Invitation will go out to our active member’s distribution list. (This is if we get the link by then)
 - i This invitation contains a link that appears in blue letters. Just click it to join the remote demo on Thursday.
 - ii Please save this where you can find it.
 1. If you don’t see the invitation(s) in your inbox, then please check your “junk” or “spam” folder. If you get our newsletters, the meeting invitation should come right into your inbox.
 2. If you did NOT get the email, the link will be posted on the SPSW website under For Members/Zoom Meeting Link
 - b. **The Saturday before the meeting.** – A reminder will be e-mailed to our active member’s distribution list.
 - c. **The day of the meeting** - Log into the meeting by 6:30pm
 - i The demo will start at 7:00pm
 - ii When you click on the link, you will be asked if you want to join with video and audio. Answer “yes” to both, then you will enter a virtual waiting room. Wait just a few seconds and one of the co-hosts will admit you into the actual meeting.
