


Starting February 1 through March 31 voting for the proposed AAW bylaws is going on in the member section of the AAW web page.

After you get into the members section on the left side column click on 2011 Bylaws vote. The report to the membership giving the reasons for these changes is in the February Journal or can be read at

http://www.woodturner.org/info/bylaws/bylaws committee 12 2010.pdf.

Please carefully consider the changes then go to the members section and vote. The biggest change is that if a motion to bring an issue before AAW occurs, every member of AAW gets to vote on that issue. Under the current bylaws 5% of our membership can sign petitions and carry the issue. The current procedure in effect disenfranchises the other 95% of our membership. The new proposed bylaws fix this problem. All AAW members are asked to carefully consider this very worthwhile amendment and vote.
