Letter from the President

Thanks to Harry, Roy, Pat, Ken, Wayne, and Doug, we will have 20 – 30 lots of highly figured and colored maple, which is all slabbed and Anchor-sealed. Ken Light has volunteered to serve as auctioneer again this year. The auction usually takes about an hour, so by about 3:30 PM hundreds of pieces of wood will have a new home. I hope you will be able to join us, and that some of it could end up in your shop! All proceeds from the wood sales benefit the SPSW and support our activities throughout the year.

Lastly, I need some help! At the Portland symposium, most of our attendees commented on the easy-to-operate camera boom system used to project all the demonstrations. I have detailed plans and directions but need someone with metalworking skills to take the lead. I am told that once we buy the materials, which only cost about \$400, it is a just weekend project for someone experienced in working with metal. I know we will have volunteers to help. We will continue to offer the by-monthly president's challenges that started last year.

Month	Challenge	Description	Winner
February	Pepper Mill	Completed	Bob Sievers
May	Embellished lathe turning	Completed	Tim Spaulding
July	Segmented Turning	Cups, vessels, or bowls constructed out of rings of glued segments. Judged on number of pieces used (highest number does not automatically win) and the esthetics of the piece,	
August	One tool	Once the piece is mounted on the lathe, create a turned piece using only one tool. Pick any one tool to complete the entire project. No sanding or finish allowed. Judged on smoothness and lack of tear out.	
October	Inside/Outside	This technique involves turning 4 pieces at the same time to create a hollow, and then turning them around and gluing them together again, to turn the outside. The result is a hollow form open on the sides, and you can add various elements inside too. I suggest that you check YouTube videos Carl Jacobson inside out Turning for ideas	
December	Holiday Decor	Ornaments, table decorations, Menorahs, candle holders and other items used to decorate for the holidays

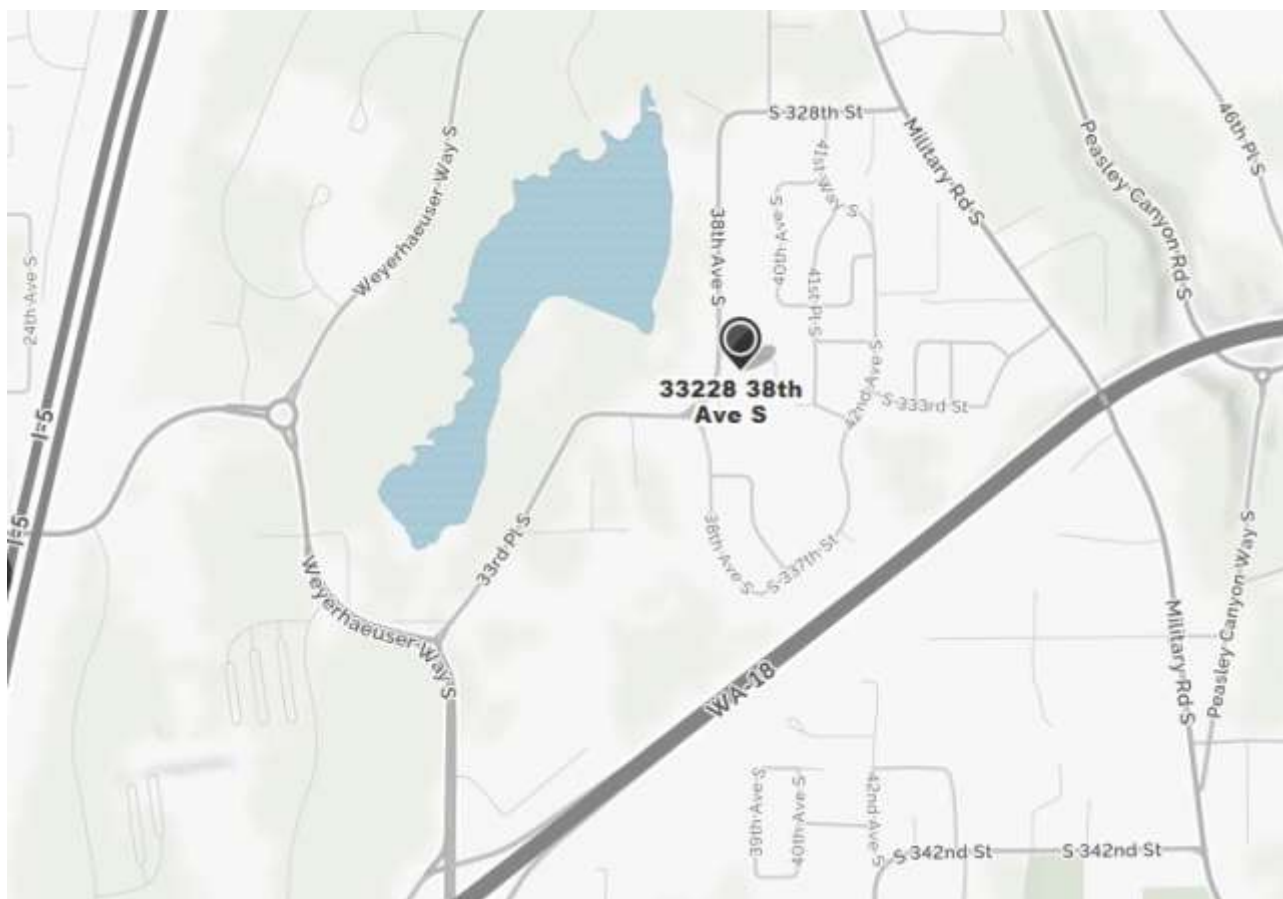

AAW Tips for Woodturners

Nylon Slide for Boring Bar

I made a Jamieson hollowing system for my JET mini lathe. I didn't want metal-to-metal contact between my boring bar and rear tool rest. Keeping a piece of wax handy would be a lost cause. The solution was to attach a .25" (6mm)-thick strip of nylon along the bottom of the backrest where the boring bar sets. The nylon sticks up above the metal about .03215" to .0625" (.8mm–1.6mm) and allows the metal boring bar to glide as though it were on waxed metal.

I have considered tapering the nylon so the boring bar rides on .0625" (1.6mm) strip instead of .25" (6mm).

The nylon is a white sheet I purchased at the Woodworking shows from one of the vendors. It comes in a variety of sizes and thicknesses. It is very slick. I also made a wooden Jameson system for my JET1642 and used a strip of the nylon on the wooden backrest. The boring bar glides on the nylon instead of rubbing on wood.
