Letter from the President



2018 moves forward with interesting demonstrations at monthly meetings and very active sawdust sessions. In my message **this month, I'd like to focus on the last** chance at the discounted registration for the AAW Symposium, Sawdust Sessions, and restarting an SPSW mentoring program.

AAW Symposium: It has been many years since the American Association of Woodturners (AAW) has held their highly regarded 4-day symposium on the west coast, but this year it **will be just "down the road" in Portland from June 14**th – 17th. So far, 26 SPSW members are signed up to take advantage of **the AAW's discounted pre**-registration offer for AAW Chapters like the SPSW. You need to be an AAW member to qualify for the discounted registration, but AAW dues plus the discounted registration price is much cheaper than non-member registra-

Sawdust Sessions: I'd like to focus a bit on the sawdust sessions this month in this President's message. First and foremost, special thanks to Nancy Sweazey, both for offering her shop for these Saturday sessions, and for her excellent brownies!

The sessions we have had so far this year have been wonderful; very well attended and busy! At last month's, we had 23 people and 5 lathes going continuously from 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM. We usually have a few new members show up, but also have a larger group of experienced members willing to help new turners, or who have a special project they would like some help with getting started. Most of us who go to these Saturday sessions feel privileged to pass on some of the skills others have shared with us over the years. Please join us, and get ready for some fun because, as usual, we will be having another sawdust session the Saturday after our meeting. See me if you need the address or directions. Newer turners, be sure to bring along any tools or projects that you have. We can help with getting your tools sharpened or getting your project on a lathe to get you started.

SPSW Mentors

SPSW Mentors: At our last Board of Directors meeting, we determined that we should update our mentor list and then see if we can better connect people hoping for a little "one-onone" instruction with people able to provide that service. Mentors are SPSW members that have enough experience to invite other club members into their shops and help them learning various turning skills. In the past, the SPSW has identified a group of skilled turners that invited people into their shops and helped people to gain new skills. This service is very valuable to newer turners and also helps connect our members with each other. Over the next couple of months, we will be asking for volunteers willing to fill this role.

Sometimes people hesitate to volunteer for such a role, thinking that they "don't know everything", and therefore aren't qualified to teach. The fact of the matter is, you don't need to be the best turner in the club or be a professional teacher to be very effective in this role! If you are able to have someone come over to your shop and are willing to pass on the skills that have been passed on to you, then you would be a great mentor. All you need is to have a solid understanding of basic turning techniques and be able to show people how to turn safely. Remember that some of our new members have never turned before, and just need a little help to get started. Also, if you have an unusual thing that you do, many people, both new and longer-term members, would love to have a little one-on-one time with you. Special or unusual things might be things like pepper mills, bowls, segmented turning, hollowforms, lidded boxes, coring, stabilizing wood, or many other skills we are all trying to master.

We will be bringing this up at the April meeting, but in the meantime, please think about volunteering to be identified as one of our mentors. I assure you that it will bring a great deal of satisfaction. It is also a great way to make new friends, and get even more enjoyment out of your SPSW membership.

Month	Challenge	Description	Winner
February	Pepper Mill	Completed	Bob Sievers
April	Embellished lathe turning	Create any sort of turning, but and use various tech- niques to enhance the piece. Examples of "embellishments" include, but are not limited to, surface texturing, Rose engine turning, or adding color with dies, pens, or paints.	
June	Segmented Turning	Cups, vessels, or bowls constructed out of rings of glued segments. Judged on number of pieces used (highest number does not automatically win) and the esthetics of the piece,	
August	One tool	Once the piece is mounted on the lathe, create a turned piece using only one tool. Pick any one tool to complete the entire project. No sanding or finish allowed. Judged on smoothness and lack of tear out.	
October	Inside/Outside	This technique involves turning 4 pieces at the same time to create a hollow, and then turning them around and gluing them together again, to turn the outside. The re- sult is a hollow form open on the sides, and you can add various elements inside too. I suggest that you check YouTube videos Carl Jacobson inside out Turning for ideas	
December	Holiday Decor	Ornaments, table decorations, Menorahs, candle holders and other items used to decorate for the holidays


