Letter from the President

Hello again, woodturners! This month, I would like to use a little of this space to remind everyone about our store sales. Every month, Ken and Polly haul in all sorts of materials needed by our members and offer them at prices that just can't be beat. Please stop by and take a look. We offer some hard to find items too. For example, there is a dry lubricant called Dyna-Glide that I use all the time to lubricate my four jaw chucks, and bearings on my lathe. Oil-based lubricants attract wood dust and, over time, these precision-machined items can get badly gummed up and prematurely wear out. Additionally, there are wide range of

finishing materials, super glues, high grade sand paper and other items available.

Ken and Polly are always on the lookout for new products. At the AAW meeting, we found a new desiccant material called the "Drying Solution" that is used to dry green wood more quickly, and without checking or excessive warp age. Just rough turn your blanks, and stick it in this granular material, and it will dry in a few weeks rather than waiting for months! It is packaged in a 15-pound bag and costs \$80. It changes color when it soaks up the water from your wood, can be refreshed in the oven, and can be reused multiple times. We bought enough to sell 11 units and have already sold 6 of them. Check all of this out at the next meeting if you are interested in trying this new product.

We are also going to have a couple of tables at this mini-symposium that members can use to sell or trade turning tools and equipment that you're not using. Please be sure to mark the price and your name on any tools you bring so that people will know who to pay!

According to the bylaws, I am required to appoint a nominating committee chairperson in August, and Pat McCart will be filling that role this year. The nominating committee is charged with nominating a slate of directors to serve on the Board of Directors. Many of our current board members have volunteered to continue serving in their positions next year, but we will have several openings. Right now, it looks like we will be looking for people to fill positions as directors in charge or library, newsletter, and probably two Directors At-Large. Please consider volunteering to serve on the Board. It mainly involves attending a Board meeting each month in addition to our other activities. Please consider serving on the board. This is where you tape four pieces of wood together and cut away some wood, so that when you un-tape it, and put it back together with the already cut parts facing the inside it forms a Christmas tree or a snowman, or something like that. An idea came up at last night's board meeting, and Leah Young, our current Librarian, will be putting together a new feature on the SPSW website featuring links to YouTube videos related to the current President's Challenge. So be looking for that. Incidentally, Leah will be shifting to a different responsibility on the Board next year, so we will need a new Librarian, if you might be interested in that position.

I look forward to seeing everyone at the meeting and Sawdust Session this month. In the meantime, be safe and make some shavings!

AAW Tips for Woodturners

Buttons for Jumbo/Cole Jaws

Sometimes when using my jumbo/Cole-type jaws to finish the bottom of a bowl, I find the standard buttons are not tall enough. I started looking around for something else to use.

I noticed synthetic wine corks and decided to try them. I drilled through them on my lathe, held in a set of small spigot jaws. I added some M6-1 × 50mm bolts and the new, longer buttons work super.

I have since discovered a commercial product similar to my idea, but mine uses something that would otherwise be thrown away, is fun to obtain (drink responsibly), and costs about \$2. Also, they leave no black or other colored marks on the surface of the wood.
