Letter from the President

Dues: Thanks to all of you, we had a very successful 2018, and our membership grew to more than 180 paid-up members for the year. But it is time to pay dues again for the 2019 calendar year. Bylaws: The board presented proposed bylaws changes at the last meeting for a vote at this coming membership meeting in November. I would characterize most of these changes as "housekeeping" in that they make no major changes in the way the SPSW operates. If approved, these changes clarify the terms "officer" and "director" and remove some jobs from the bylaws and move them to Board operating procedures. Personally, I encourage a "yes" vote at the meeting to pass these proposed changes.

Nominations: November is the month we elect a new board for the coming year. Fortunately, we have a strong slate of officers for your consideration. Most of last year's board have volunteered to continue serving in their positions next year. But, we are looking specifically looking new board members to serve in the librarian position and the newsletter position. The librarian mainly coordinates what is on the web page's instruction videos. Also, we need someone to take over for Don getting this newsletter out to the members each month. Christmas Party: One of the biggest events on the annual SPSW calendar is our annual holiday dinner. This is a potluck event, and the food is always great. Also, each year, we purchase gift certificates or high-quality turning tools from the many vendors that support all of us through the year. We also will be buying some \$800 worth of excellent bowl blanks and other wood. All of this will be given away to members attending this event. DON'T MISS IT!!!

Our goal this year will be for every member to go home with at least one piece of wood. Members get tickets from Terry Broberg at the membership table. Members earn tickets at our meetings by participating! This is by helping to set up, put things away, unload or load the trailer, or bringing something for show and tell. In this way, you can earn up to 3 tickets per meeting. If you have not gotten your tickets in, stop by and see Terry at the November meeting and catch up. If you know you helped set up at 5 meetings, get 5 tickets and put your name on them, then put them in the can. If you brought show and tell projects in 4 times, get another 4 tickets. But get your tickets in the can, as these are the tickets will be drawn to distribute the tools, gift certificates, and a few very special pieces of wood.

After last year's Christmas party, the Board noticed that some of our more active members with lots of tickets in the can ended up with multiple raffle items, where other members walked away from this event with only a piece of wood. This year, as I mentioned, we want everyone to be able to get something at the raffle. Therefore, we are going to limit each member to one prize. If one of your tickets is drawn from the can you will get the item being raffled off. But if another of your tickets is called, then you will have a choice. You can either keep the prize you already won, or if you like the new item better, then you can give the first item back and take the new one.

The Board hopes that this change will further encourage participation in meetings, but also spread the wealth a bit further than has sometimes happened in the past.


