Annual Wood Auction and Picnic: Thanks to the efforts of so many different SPSW members, and family members we had a wonderful and successful annual wood auction and picnic on July 21st. I think that this one was our very best picnic and wood auction ever! Thanks to all of you that made that happen.

I can't possibly name each of you that contributed your efforts to make this event the success that it was. But, just to name a few, it all started with Doug Reynolds and his crew of woodrats! They collected wood through the year, and we ended up with about 67 lots of 4 to 5 pieces of wood. Sunday morning, a whole bunch of people showed up to unload the trucks and trailers and separate the wood into the groups that people would bid on later. Each lot seemed to have at least one special piece, either highly-figured, or a burl.

Thanks to Chris Johnson for setting up our use of the facility. Thanks to everyone who brought food, chairs, helped set up the food, and unloaded and helped to organize all the wood into lots. Many thanks to Ken Light for being our auctioneer again this year. It is not an easy job to keep everything straight, and thanks to the spotters who helped make sure that every bid was considered! Thanks to Polly Light, Ryan Howard, Donna Abeles, and Stephanie Lane, all of whom helped get all the bidders a number, kept track of who bought what, and then collected the money at the end. Everyone seemed to pitch in as they were needed. Thanks to each of you!!!

Folks really came through on the food for the potluck lunch. We had a great meal, and people really seemed to enjoy the opportunity to meet and get to know other members better.

When Ken Light started up the auction about 1:00, there was spirited competition to buy the wood. Unlike past auctions where the average winning bid was about \$17/lot, this time the average was \$37. Some lots had such spectacular wood that they went for over \$100. The bottom line was that the club took in \$2,594.00! That is more than 2.5 times what we made on wood last year! In case you wonder where all that money goes, it helps to financially support the club's activities through the year. Those costs include facilities rentals, buying better audio-visual equipment that we use at the meetings, paying speaker's fees, scheduling seminars, and buying the wood and tools that we give away to members at holiday dinner in December.

We made some minor changes to setting up the auction in the shade, how we track bids and bidders, and how to split up what food people are asked to bring this time. If you noticed anything else that you thought we could do better next time, please let us know.

If you weren't able to attend this auction, be sure to reserve the date for next year. We'll do this again on the third Sunday in July 2020!

No Sawdust Session This Month: There is no "Sawdust Session" in July and August, because so many people have family obligations or are out of town. We will start up again in September.

Mini-Symposium coming in September: Twice a year, at our regular meeting, we have a mini-symposium in lieu of our usual demonstrator. At this mini-symposium, individual members do presentations and you can wander around and see and talk to those doing the demonstrations.

If you have something you do that you would like to demonstrate, we will be passing around a sign-up sheet at the August meeting. Please consider doing this. It is a great way to ease into becoming a full demonstrator. In addition to the normal presentations, we will have a table where you can get any questions you might have about woodturning, or even get connected with a mentor.

We will also have a used tool sale table again at this one. Get your extra stuff ready to pass onto to someone else. We all think "...were just one tool from greatness." Be sure to mark your items with your price and your name.

Coming VERY soon - Limited Participation Seminar - Pyrography with Cynthia Gibson. Program chair Dave Best is coordinating with the Vancouver B.C. woodturners group to offset travel costs and bring Cynthia Gibson for a 2-day SPSW seminar on pyrography or "wood-burning". Cynthia has worked with many professional woodturners on collaborative projects. In addition to the Thursday night meeting, she will be offering a hands-on class on Wednesday and Thursday. The class will be limited to 10 - 12 participants and the cost will be \$100/day, or \$185 for both days. Participants will need to bring wood-burning equipment to participate in the class.
