Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

June 25, 2019

Call to Order – President John Howard called the meeting to order at 7:00pm at his residence. Sawdust Session – It was a good session with 10-11 people attending. There were two new turners present and they got to spend quite a bit of time on the lathe with help from the other attendees. There were 4 lathes setup.

Newsletter Editor – John mention that there is a need for a volunteer to take over publication of our monthly newsletter. He will mention it again at the next general meeting.

New Business – The annual picnic/wood auction will be held on Sunday July 21st with setup starting at noon to drop off wood and setup for the auction. John indicated that he needs help transporting wood from his house and transporting the wood stored at Ray Pelzel's. Potluck will be served at 1:00. People with last names beginning with A-L are to bring a main dish, M-S to bring Salads and chips and T-Z to bring desserts. The wood auction will begin at 2:00 and will be held at the North Lake Improvement Club in Federal Way.

June 2019 SPSW Webmaster Report

This report is for the four weeks since the last report. There have been four new posts and the June newsletter.

There have been 379 sessions (visits) (avg. 13.5/day) made by 305 users (visitors) totaling 1,657 pageviews and an average of 4.4 pages/session. For this report period the average sessions is down from 16 to 13.5 but the average pages per session is up from 4.1 to 4.4. Of those 305 users, 88% are new. The highest daily number of sessions was 19 on June 4th and the lowest was 7 on June 15th. Of the 379 sessions, 138 were on mobile devices (69 on iPhones) and 48 on tablets (all 48 on iPads). The average time spent on the site for returning users was 2:54, for new users was 1:41.

Of the 379 sessions, 184 (49%) were from Google, 104 (27%) were direct (user typed in our URL or bookmarked), 24 (6%) were from Bing and 18 (5%) were from Pinterest.

Chrome was the most popular browser for users (42%) compared to Safari (26%) and Internet Explorer (9%).

Of the 379 sessions, 104 (27%) continued to a second page, 69 (18%) continued to a third page and 35 (9%) continued to a fourth. The most popular page is the home page (338 pageviews), followed by the calendar (129 pageviews) and the "About" page (65 pageviews).

Of the users that Google identifies, 65% of this report's users are age 55 and older, while none were identified as under 35 years old. 85% of the users are men. The age and gender statistics are limited by what Google collects. 7% are food and cooking enthusiasts, 7% are hobbies and outdoor enthusiasts and 6% are home and garden DIYers. 36% have an interest in home & garden, i.e. tools, improvement, services, décor and furnishings.

There were users from 193 cities in 27 countries on 6 continents. The highest numbers of users were from Seattle – 31, Chicago – 13, Tacoma – 11, Puyallup & Tacoma - 8 and Muju-Gun South Korea - 7. By country, the US was highest at 77%, the U.K. was next at 5% and Australia was third at 3%. American English was used by 82% of the users, while 7% used British English and 2% used Korean.

There are 128 subscribers to the SPSW Members mailing list and 1 who has not completed the process.

There are now 246 non-members that have signed up to receive the monthly newsletter. Per the mailer program, there are 190 addresses on the Black List, 0 that were bouncing (email address doesn't exist now) that have now been removed and 3 that have not confirmed.

I am happy to take suggestions for content for the website. I don't mind doing some research, if necessary, based on the suggestion.

Our Facebook page has 87 likes and 94 follows.

Our Pinterest pins get an average of 6,163 monthly viewers, 175 monthly engaged viewers both of which are down from last month. 23% of viewers were from the U.S., 7% from the U.K., \$% from Canada, 4% from France, Australia and Germany. By city, 4.6% were from L.A., 3.2% were from San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, 2.6% from New York, Dallas-Ft. Worth and Phoenix. 98% have an interest in home décor and 96% have an interest in DIY and crafts. Of those that have an interest in DIY & crafts, 83% have an interest in DIY projects, 71% in upcycled crafts, 46% in upcycled home decor and 36% in

woodworking techniques. 46% of the audience are over 55, 21% are under 35; 74% are male, 22% are female and 4% are unspecified. 51% of the audience used desktops 37% use Android mobile, 19% used iPhone. The most popular pins in the last month are John Beaver wave bowl jigs and the Chinese ball made by Fred Holder.

Our Twitter account has 388 followers. Twitter has de-emphasized likes and no longer provides a total "like" count.
