October Pyrography with Cynthia Gibson Demonstration and Seminar:

This month Cynthia Gibson will be our demonstrator at the regular October membership meeting. The opportunity to attend demonstrations at regular meetings are a part of what your SPSW dues pay for each year.

But in addition, and at extra cost, the SPSW is sponsoring Cynthia's 2-day wood burning seminar on Wednesday and Thursday. This is a rare opportunity to get some world-class instruction to expand your skills locally, without having to pay for travel and hotel costs! **As I write this, we only have 5 slots remaining for members to enroll.**

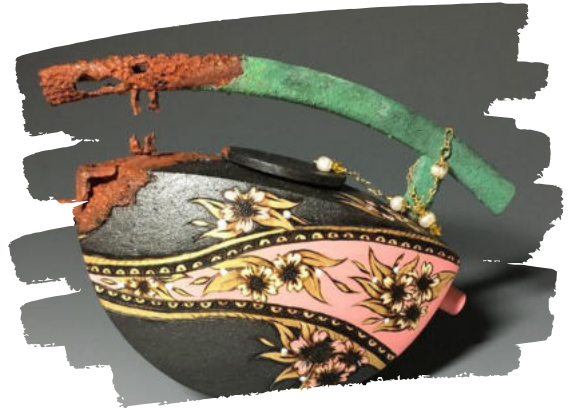




On Wednesday, Oct. 16th from 9:00 – 4:30, participants in Cynthia's seminar will see what she calls "**Pyro 101**" during which she discusses wood choices and proper preparation for wood-burning. Participants will gain practice by creating a grid with various wood-burning textures and patterns. Participants need to bring a wood burner, tips, and a dry, well sanded maple board approximately 8"x 10". More detailed information will be sent to participants after enrolling for the classes. Let us know if you need to borrow a wood-burner. We have a few wood-burners that people have offered for those that don't have one.

On Thursday Oct 17th from 9:00 – 4:30, Cynthia will demonstrate the design process she uses and then participants will apply those principals to enhance a bowl, platter, or hollow-form project they bring with them. Students should give prior thought to what they want to do, and also bring either a project or a flat board sanded to 600 grit. Light colored woods such as maple, box elder and pear are preferred.

Costs for the seminar are \$100/day or \$180 for both days. The seminar will be at Nancy's shop in Bonney Lake. There will be a lunch break where people can either eat a sack lunch they bring with them, or they can go to one of the many fast food venues in the area.

Mentorship – Moving Forward Quickly!

Having someone to help you get started in woodturning can advance your skills very quickly. At our last mini-symposium meeting, Michael Poirier set up a mentorship table and various SPSW club mentors were available to answer basic questions about woodturning. In addition, Michael was working to connect less experienced members with very experienced turners. Efforts are being made to connect folks with interest in the same kinds of woodturning (pens, bowls, hollow forms, etc.), and also hook people up with mentors in their same geographic area. Several connections were made at this last meeting. Invitations to visit shops and get some one-on-one instruction were extended. The SPSW's Board of Directors hopes to expand a more formal mentorship program within the club. Take advantage of this opportunity! Sawdust Session – Restart:

Our very popular Saturday Sawdust Sessions started up again this past month. About 13 members met the Saturday after our regular meeting at Nancy's shop in Bonney Lake at 9:00 AM. We had a number of newer turners attending, and each of them got to turn some wood and practice new skills. Some more experienced members, who do not have access to a large lathe at home, used the big lathes at Nancy's to rough turn some larger bowls. These sessions are a huge benefit of membership in the SPSW, and I hope more of our members will be able to attend future sawdust sessions. Please join us. I assure you, that you will be glad you did!

Board member Dan Dickey has capably served as our Treasurer for several years. Dan is retiring from his position, and we need someone to step into this role on our Board of Directors.
